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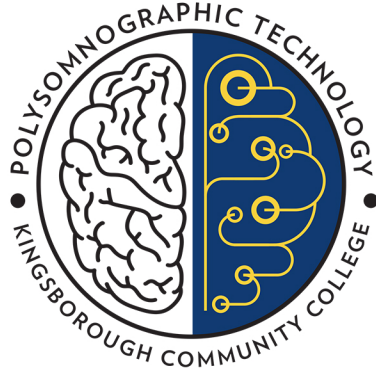

What is Polysomnographic Technology?

Sleep technology, also known as Polysomnographic Technology, is a distinct allied health field that studies sleep-related disorders. It involves the measurement of multiple physiological parameters during sleep, combined with observational reporting.

Polysomnographic technicians, or sleep technicians, are healthcare professionals who work as part of a team under the general supervision of a licensed physician to assist in the education, evaluation, and treatment of sleep disorders in patients of all ages.

This Associate in Applied Science (AAS) degree in Polysomnographic Technology is a 60-credit program that will provide in-depth classroom instruction and fieldwork placement in a clinical sleep laboratory. Students will be trained in all aspects of sleep medicine required to work as a professional sleep technician. Upon graduating from this program, students will be eligible to obtain a New York State license to practice as a Polysomnographic Technician (or Sleep Technician).

Employment information

The New York State Department of Education recently passed a law requiring sleep technicians to have a minimum of an associate's degree in Polysomnographic Technology. In New York City, there is a need for well-trained sleep technicians. KCC is the first college in New York City to offer a New York State, Department of Education approved program.

Life as a polysomnographic technician typically involves performing nighttime sleep studies to screen and treat patients for various sleep disorders. Daytime studies and scoring of nighttime records are also common work tasks for senior sleep technicians.

The annual salary for a licensed polysomnographic technician ranges from \$40,000-\$65,000. Full time employment may also include excellent benefits. Many hospitals and laboratories offer full-time work hours comprising three, 12-hour night shifts per week. Per-diem work is also often available. Therefore, sleep technicians can typically continue to pursue higher education (or other interests) while still working full-time.
