Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:


- The Academic Director and Department Chair from both programs will review the agreement annually. They will be expected to review student retention, progress to graduation including transitions between prerequisite and follow-on courses, degree completion, and GPA. Modification or termination of this agreement requires the approval of both Chief Academic Officers of both institutions.
- Should the agreement be modified or terminated, Kingsborough Community College shall honor the terms granted to students who have already transferred into the A.S. in Early Childhood Education / Child Care for a period of four years or graduation, whichever comes first.
- The CUNY Institutional Research Database will be used to track all transfer students, including their performance (credit accumulation and GPA) and persistence (retention and graduation).
- Both the CUNY School of Professional Studies and Kingsborough Community College value this agreement and see it as a "win" for our students. Both schools will feature the agreement in their annual bulletins, course catalogs, Web sites, and program marketing materials.

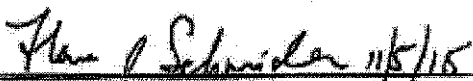
