### B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

- Completion of the A.A. degree and a minimum GPA of 2.70\*
- Recommended cumulative average of B or better in Major courses.
- Students entering the program are required to complete at least half (21 Credits) of the B.A. Government and Politics major course requirements with St. John's University.
- It is the responsibility of the incoming transfer student to check the current requirements for the B.A. in Government and Politics at St. John's University. The student is required to follow the requirements in effect at the time of his or her entrance to St. John's University even if they are different from what are found in this agreement.
- St. John's University retains the right to make the final decision on each student's application.

*\*Students interested in pursuing the Graduate Pathway option will be expected to hold a 3.00 GPA (refer to section C of this agreement for details).*

### Notes:

1. Students interested in pursuing the graduate pathway option BA/MA Government and Politics are invited to apply after they have completed a minimum of 12 undergraduate credits including GOV 1050 with St. John's, and is open to students who have a 3.00 cumulative and major GPA with Kingsborough and St. John's. (Admission is not guaranteed). In the student's second semester with St. John's, students in the program may take 3 Graduate level credits. Second year, the student will take a total of 12 Graduate credits. In the final year of study (Graduate study), the student will complete the remaining Graduate degree courses, 18 credits, for a total of 33 credits.

## **E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES**

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement: When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by a representative from each institution.
2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success: Each semester St. John's University will provide Kingsborough Community College with the following information: a) the number of KBCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of KBCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of KBCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.: This articulation agreement will be publicized on the KBCC website, and St. John's University website. Transfer advisers at KBCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
