B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

- Kingsborough Community College students with an AAS in nursing must have an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Current licensure in New York State as a Registered Professional Nurse, or eligibility to sit for the National Council Licensure Examination - RN (NCLEX-RN) - in New York State. Students who do not currently hold an RN license may apply to the program in the last semester of their pre-licensure program in anticipation of licensure. Unlicensed students who meet the eligibility criteria will be admitted on a case by case basis and will be required to obtain their RN license before beginning their second term in the program.
- Students can transfer in a maximum of 90 credits to CUNY SPS.
- There is a 30 credit residency requirement for the B.S. in Nursing at CUNY SPS.
- Courses that are completed at Kingsborough Community College that are deemed equivalent to B.S. in Nursing required courses will be transferrable provided that the student has received a minimum grade of "C+" or better.

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 55

Total credits required to complete the baccalaureate degree: 120

C. TRANSFER CREDIT AWARDED

Kingsborough Community College graduates who complete the A.A.S. in Nursing will receive 65 credits toward the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Nursing at CUNY SPS.

Course that are completed at Kingsborough Community College that are deemed equivalent to B.S. in Nursing required courses will be transferrable provided that the student has received a minimum grade of "C".

The table on the following page lists the courses required for completing the BS in Nursing. In addition, the table indicates which courses may be transferred from KCC and those that must be completed at the School of Professional Studies as part of the major.

The CUNY Institutional Research Database will be used to track all transfer students, including their performance (credit accumulation and GPA) and persistence (retention and graduation).


3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:


This articulation agreement will be publicized on the KCC and CUNY SPS websites. Transfer advisers at KCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
