Admissions Requirements to Senior College Program: Students will meet Iona College's minimum GPA requirement for transferring students and successfully complete the transfer application process.

Completion of the A.S. Degree: Pursuant to University policy, students who have earned a City University Associate in Science (A.S.) degree will be deemed to have automatically fulfilled the lower division liberal arts and science distribution requirements for a baccalaureate degree. However, students may be required to complete courses in disciplines required by Iona College's core requirement that were not part of the student's associate degree program. Such required coursework will be applied towards the total number of credits normally required for the baccalaureate degree.

A.S. degree program graduates seeking a successful Iona College transfer will complete their A.S. degree core requirements according to "**Recommended KCC Options for Best Usable Transfer Credits**" outlined in this document and in close consultation with faculty advisors.

Total transfer credits granted towards the Baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at the Senior College to complete the Baccalaureate degree: 60

Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement: Representatives of these majors have and will continue to speak on an ongoing basis via e-mail and in meetings. Topics for discussion will include, but are not limited to, course offerings modifications, prerequisites, student achievement/enrolment, and course sequencing.

Procedures for evaluating agreement (e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success): The chair of the Communication Studies Program at Iona College will forward each semester to the chair of the Speech Communication Program at Kingsborough Community College a list of the students graduated as a result of this articulation program. Also included in this list will be information pertaining to any outstanding or significant achievements or awards earned by Kingsborough graduates during their time at Iona College. Together all of this information will facilitate an evaluation of the graduates, program completion timelines, and retention/attrition rates.

Procedures for publicizing the agreement (e.g., college catalogues, transfer advisors, Websites): Information regarding this joint program will be made available in the course catalogues, on the department websites, and at the Admissions Information Centers of both colleges. Iona College publications which describe the various speech majors will be updated to include this joint program. Kingsborough Community College will incorporate information about this joint program into documents that publicize the A.S. degree in Communication Studies and the joint programs that Kingsborough Community College has developed with four year colleges and universities. The Kingsborough staff who visits high schools for the purpose of student recruitment will be given

information about the Kingsborough/Iona Speech Communication Studies program. When possible, Iona College faculty will visit students at Kingsborough Community College in classes or as part of information events outside of class to disseminate information about the Kingsborough/Iona dual/jointly registered program.

Additional information: Upon acceptance into Iona College under this agreement students will be considered junior year students in the Iona College program. As such they will be granted the same rights and privileges of other Iona College junior students with regards to registering for classes required for the completion of the four year Baccalaureate degree.

Specifically students will choose: (a) two courses from: PHI (07100 or 07200), 07400, and 07800 to satisfy their Group A requirement, (b) HIS 05100 + one other option to satisfy their Group B – Economics-History-Political Science requirement, (c) any 2 from PSY 01100, SOC 03100, 03300 to satisfy their Group B – Anthropology – Psychology –Sociology requirement, and (d) for Group C requirements students choose 7-8 credits of courses equivalent to Iona core requirements (see advisor for acceptable courses). Students must take one Math and one science from Biology/Chemistry/Earth & Planetary Science/Physics to graduate from KBCC. Iona College does not accept KCC Mathematics courses MTH 00700, 00800, or 00900.
