## WHY ATTEND?

Kingsborough has successful, nationally recognized Learning Community programs that we are excited to share with you. This three-day Institute will give you an opportunity to network with other community college faculty, staff, and administrators while you actively collaborate and learn from each other in a magnificent beachfront setting. The program will provide the “nuts and bolts” to help you build, develop, and sustain your own Learning Community Program from the ground up.

## WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

The Institute is appropriate for individuals new to Learning Communities as well as those who seek to reflect on and strengthen their practices. Your experience will be most productive if you attend with a team consisting of, ideally, five to seven members, including administration, faculty, and student services personnel from your institution. These individuals should be poised to create and/or develop Learning Communities through a collaborative, cross-campus team approach.

## WHAT'S ON THE PROGRAM?

**Day 1:** Opening Keynote by Dr. Joye Hardiman, Faculty Emerita of the Evergreen State College, core faculty for the Washington Center for Improvement of Undergraduate Education’s National Summer Institute on Learning Communities. Following the keynote, mix and mingle during a reception with Kingsborough LC faculty and staff and workshop participants.

**Day 2:** Learn about evidenced-based practices and work as a team to create or further develop LCs at your college. Each team collaborates to create an integrative assignment—the keystone to a successful Learning Community—and then consider strategies for assessing the success of that assignment. Share your work and offer feedback on the work of others.

**Day 3:** After considering the role of Student Services in a Learning Community program, and the power of collaboration between Academic Affairs and Student Affairs, participants hear from a panel of Kingsborough students who discuss their experiences in KCC Learning Communities. The day ends with teams making plans for next steps on their campuses.
