Grant Proposals

The CUNY Direct Support Professional Alliance (the DSP Alliance) – in partnership with New York City College of Technology, submitted a \$1.2 million proposal to the CUNY Workforce Development Program for a Direct Support Professional (DSP) training program. DSPs provide support to people with developmental disabilities so they can live and work independently. If awarded, we will train 200 students over two and a half years. Upon completion, graduates will earn a CUNY DSP Alliance digital badge, receive up to six industry certifications, and eligible to apply for employment with one our partner agencies.

CUNY Clean Energy Consortium (CEC) led by Bronx Community College with Kingsborough, Queensborough and the Borough of Manhattan Community Colleges submitted a \$1.5 million proposal to the Families & Workers Fund. This program will scale workforce development trainings for green jobs in the clean energy sector. If awarded, Kingsborough will deliver a deckhand training paired with the Global Wind Organization (GWO) – Basic Safety Training, preparing people to work in the local maritime offshore wind industry.

Workforce Trainings

CUNY Fatherhood Academy (CFA)

CFA launched a **College and Career Prep** cohort and participants will be enrolled in SD11 and SD12 courses as they prepare for college enrollment and/or employment. The program will launch a GED cohort in March with 18-30-year-old fathers and expecting fathers, and participants can apply here: https://cewdkbcc.com/cuny-fatherhood-academy/

Strengthening Community Colleges (SSC)- CompTIA program

SCC launched a **CompTIA A**+ and **CompTIA Network**+ cohort. Students in this grant funded program will be provided with exam preparation and employment readiness services and well as the opportunity to participate in a 25-hour paid internship.

User Experience Upskilling program

The **User Experience (UX) Upskilling** program launched its second cohort. Students in this program will take Visual Design, Human Centered Design and Enhanced Coding for Designers classes and will receive employment readiness support to enter the field of User Experience Design.

Meta Spark Augmented Reality UX Design Program

The Meta Spark Augmented Reality (AR) UX Design program concluded on Saturday, January 14th with a showcase and closing event designed to display students' skills by building augmented experiences intended to address a particular need or challenge. The division provided a 6-week, cohort-based Augmented Reality Training program experience combining Meta Spark curriculum, creation, and career exploration for UX professionals.

During the one-day culminating event at the **Brooklyn Public Library**, students presented their projects, which were judged by industry experts who evaluated and

provided feedback on their projects. The theme of the showcase was "Local Businesses, Tech for Good." Student groups identified local businesses and produced an idea for a product built in Meta Spark Studio that will benefit the business with a goal of using AR to address the needs of customers. Students who successfully completed the program, will automatically be invited to join the Meta Career Programs job board. From there, they have the option to take the Meta Spark certification exam which will grant them access to Meta's Train the Trainer Partner Network allowing them to share their knowledge with industry peers. ESL/HSE/SNAP Venture Programs

Free Adult Literacy and Food Handlers certificate training programs are available to non-native speakers who want to improve their English language skills, pursue further study and employment opportunities for the Winter/Spring 2024 semesters.
