

CPE SCORES: FAQs

Q: How can I obtain my CPE score?

A: You can obtain your scores in the following ways:

- 1) on eCPE which is available through the CUNY portal. eCPE provides you with a detailed score report for each CPE you've taken. The score report is an invaluable tool especially if you must re-test. The link to eCPE can be found on the KCC CPE web page (www.kbcc.cuny.edu/cpe) on the lower left-hand side. You need your CUNY Portal PIN for access. If you do not know your CUNY Portal PIN, contact the campus IT help desk in L117, 718.368.6679.
- 2) via the KCC Office of Testing website. The link to this website can be found on the KCC CPE web page on the lower left-hand side ("CPE Results"). You need your eSIMS PIN for access. If you do not know your eSIMS PIN, contact the Office of the Registrar (A101) or request it on-line via their web page.
- 3) CUNY mails the score reports to the address they have on file. The mailing happens one to two weeks after the score reports are available online.
- 4) on eSIMS (available by going to the "eSIMS Online Registration" link located on the KCC home page). Once you log in, click on "Transcript." You will see CPE listed and your results are reported with a "P" (pass) or an "F" (fail); no numerical score is recorded nor is the exam date indicated which can lead to confusion if you've tested more than once.

Q: Six weeks have passed since I took the CPE, why can't I obtain my score?

A: CUNY usually posts the CPE scores by six weeks after the conclusion of the exam each semester/module. However, occasionally it takes a little longer.

Q: Other students who took the CPE when I did received their results, but I haven't. Why is this?

A: Most likely the reason is that your exam is being appealed. There is an automatic appeal process in place for the CPE. All exams which come within two points of passing (passing = 34) are re-read by a third reader. This process delays these exams by approximately one week after the non-appealed exams' scores are available.

Q: I wish to appeal my CPE score, how may I do so?

A: There is an automatic appeals process in place for students who come within 2 points of passing (see previous Q & A). As per CUNY, no other appeal is possible.
