Three Types of Online Courses

There are three types of online course that you can find at CUNYfirst:

- **Online (Synchronous):** has a specific date and time
- **TBA (Asynchronous):** does not have a specific date and time
- **Hybrid:** has a specific date and time, but the instructor will determine meeting frequency

Online (Synchronous)

Students meet in real-time online on specific days and times

Ex.: Mon/Wed 8AM-9AM

For class access, students must:

- log in to virtual learning platform/course
- commit to scheduled class days and times
- engage with instructors and classmates
- be virtually present at the same time weekly

Online (Synchronous)

The class meets on specific days and at specific times

- Class interactions are not mandatory


BUT:

Why Synchronous or Hybrid Classes?

Good choice/s for students who do not have job requirements or personal circumstances during a specific time of day

- predictable meeting days and times
- frequent face-to-face interaction with faculty members and classmates
- real-time discussions with faculty members and classmates
- time commitments to be online at specific days and times

Why TBA (Asynchronous)?

Good choice for students who have job requirements or personal circumstances during a specific time of day

- work independently in a self-paced style without having to meet at a regularly scheduled times
- maximum flexibility when it comes to choosing when to read course assignments and complete assignments/exams
- limited access to technology
- able to manage own schedule/plan long-term projects/ keep deadlines
