Procedures for Applying for WAC Certification

2. Speak to your Chair to be sure he or she thinks you're a good candidate.

Discuss the Spring 2019 **course** you want to work on during the Winter certification training. Your task will be to make it more reading and writing intensive in alignment with your teaching/learning goals for this particular course.

- You must have taught the course at least once at Kingsborough.
- Pilot: You must be scheduled to teach the course in Spring 2019 and it should be designated "writing intensive" with an enrollment cap of 25.
- It must meet for at least 3 hours.

As part of this conversation, arrange to receive **reassigned time** during the Spring piloting semester. See the attached "Reassigned Time" page for the details (p. 2)

- 3. Fill out the attached **application form** (p.3). You may also download one from our website: <u>www.kbcc.cuny/WAC</u>
- 4. Attach hard copy of your **current syllabus** for the course. Since you have already taught this course at Kingsborough, you have a personal syllabus; don't send us a generic departmental syllabus. Remember, it must be a course you have taught at least once at Kingsborough.
- 5. Send or **bring the application with attached syllabus** to: Prof. Gordon Alley-Young, WAC Coordinator for the Writing Intensive Program, and Chair, in E309.

If you are already teaching on a writing intensive basis, and have received training elsewhere, you may be eligible to become certified without completing our certification process. Consider Option C. See the KBCC WAC website for more information.

Guidance on Reassigned Time: WAC Certification Training, Course Pilot, and Portfolio Submission

As a candidate for Writing Intensive Certification, you will receive three hours of reassigned time for the following. 1. Completing the certification training over the Winter module, including the submission of a provisional course portfolio by February 15. 2. Piloting a section of your revised course during the Spring term. 3. Submitting a final revised course portfolio with sample student writing by June 30th.

In order for you to have the time to reflect on and revise course materials as you progress through your course pilot as well as revise and submit your final course portfolio at the end of the semester, you will be provided three hours of reassigned time while you pilot your newly designed syllabus during the Spring semester.¹

If you are an adjunct faculty who wishes to participate in the WAC Program, you may be assigned the equivalent of 3 semester hours (75 NTA hours) as part of your 9 hour total in the Spring semester as you pilot your course.²

All full-time and adjunct teaching and non-teaching assignments must be approved by your Department Chair. If you have questions concerning eligibility and procedures for reassigned time in the Spring term, you should speak with him, her or them.

¹ According to CUNY's multiple position policy, faculty members are paid a salary for all obligations during their period of annual appointment. When a non-teaching work assignment exceeds the normally expected service obligations, faculty may be provided reassigned time to be counted as part of a faculty member's regular workload.

² Adjunct faculty are limited to a workload of 9 hours each semester (the equivalent of three, 3-credit courses).
