Act 2, Scene 1

Cassio gets drunk and gets into a fight with Montano,	p. 51, 141-151
Roderigo, etc.	
Iago tells Othello that Cassio drank too much and got	p. 55, line 238
into a fight, and Othello fires Cassio. Othello specifically	p. 54, line 236
asks Iago what happened.	
Iago advises Cassio to be nice to Desdemona and talk to	p. 57, line 306
her about getting his job back. We know Iago will make	
it look like Cassio and Desdemona are romantically	
involved.	
lago is alone on stage and it seems he's convinced that	p. 58
he's not even a villain for conceiving of this plan to get	
Cassio to look like he's romantically involved with	
Desdemona.	
Roderigo threatens to leave Iago, and Iago drags him	p. 59
back in to make sure he can go through with his plan.
