B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Graduates of the KCC A.A. in Liberal Arts: Philosophy Concentration will qualify for admission into the BC Bachelor of Arts degree in the Philosophy: Philosophy Track program if they have maintained a minimum overall GPA of 2.0 and are in good academic standing at KCC. Applicants will follow the standard admissions process, which includes completing a transfer application.

Graduates of KCC's A.A. Liberal Arts: Philosophy Concentration who have not completed at least one year of foreign language study (or established an equivalent proficiency) may be asked to complete six (6) to eight (8) credits of foreign language course work (or establish an equivalent proficiency) in addition to their normal degree requirements in order to meet BC's Language Other than English (LOTE) requirement. Proficiency may be established based upon high school course work, native language abilities, or examination.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60

Total credits required for the B.A. in Philosophy: Philosophy Track: 120

C. Transfer Credit Awarded

KCC graduates who complete the A.A. in Liberal Arts: Philosophy Concentration will receive 60 credits toward the B.A. in Philosophy: Philosophy Track program at BC.

Transferred credits will be applied to the Baccalaureate degree as professional credits, course specific transfer credits and electives. Students will meet with a BC advisor who will review their transcripts to ensure appropriate placement within the program.

F. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW - UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating the agreement:

The sending and receiving departments at each college commit to meeting regularly to review and revise this articulation agreement in response to programmatic, curricular, and disciplinary changes.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

The CUNY Institutional Research Database will be used to track all transfer students, including their performance (credit accumulation and GPA) and persistence (retention and graduation).

3. Campus Updates to Transfer Credit Rules:

Each college will update their transfer rules in CUNYFirst based on the agreed upon course evaluation, as indicated in this document, when either College revises any course included in this agreement, they will notify the other party to ensure equivalencies remain accurately scribed in CUNYFirst and CUNY Transfer Explorer (T-Rex)

4. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the KCC and BC websites. Transfer advisors at KCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

G. Additional Information (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)

Transfer students are eligible to apply for financial aid that is normally available to other junior standing students.

Students who register for a minimum of 12 credits per semester are eligible for all federal and state grant programs for When they meet income eligibility requirements.

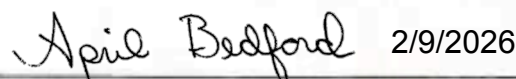
