The Center will continue to partner with BNY for upcoming spring and summer internships. ## **Program Updates**

The *Academic/ESL Program* recently submitted a proposal for the Venture V for SNAP Participants Program, successor to KCC's successful SNAP E&T Venture IV Program, which recently concluded in September 2021. The proposed Program will provide support for lowincome adult learners in our local community; adults and eligible youth ages 18 to 24 who are Supplemental Nutrition Assistant Program (SNAP) applicants and recipients, including those also receiving Safety Net Assistance (SNA), will receive the ABE/HSE/ESL

education, vocational training and ongoing case management and counseling support that they need to enter the workforce by finding employment offering a living wage and clearly defined career pathways.

Thirty-three (33) students successfully participated/completed career exploration courses offered asynchronously in partnership with the *Administration for Children's Services (ACS)*. Students residing in ACS facilities participated in Emerging Trends in Healthcare, The Business of Music and Introduction to Entrepreneurship in an effort to learn more about career pathways and college enrollment. Students received certificates from Kingsborough Community College and are encouraged to apply to KCC upon completion of their HS diploma/HSE studies. The Business of Music course (VSE90) will be offered to the public through Continuing Education beginning on November 8 (10 weeks, \$125). Apply here or call (718) 368-5050.

**CUNY Fatherhood Academy** Cohort 12 began with 19 students enrolled. We are now recruiting for College and Career Prep (CCP). Students in CCP receive assistance with college enrollment and financial aid, career and college exploration, job application, resume writing, interviewing skills and professionalism, work experience through internships and workshops on parenthood topics such as parenthood, health and financial literacy, incentives and earn up to 2 college credits applicable towards their transcript when they apply to Kingsborough. Prospective applicants can <u>apply here</u>.

*Job Corps Scholars* will be recruiting for Winter 2022. Applicants who have their HS diploma/HSE can apply for Continuing Education courses in health, business and technology at no cost. They will also receive wrap around supportive services to support personal, academic and professional goals. Students receive assistance with entering employment, enrolling into college and/or apprenticeships. Learn more and apply here.

**DesignWorks UX Design** training will begin in January. This six-month training provides five User Experience Design courses at no cost to students who are 18+ years old, legally eligible to work in the US and reside in NYC. Students will learn about visual design, human centered design, coding for designers, entrepreneurship and take a capstone class, where they will work with real clients. Students will receive employment readiness services, job placement assistance, paid internships and college enrollment support. Applicants can <u>apply here</u>.

*Strengthening Community Colleges (SCC) Comp TLA* program will launch in January. This FREE online training course will cover the fundamentals of PC hardware & software and prepare students for an entry level position in Information Technology. Applicants must be 18+, have a HS diploma/HSE and be legally eligible to work in the US. Learn more and <u>apply here</u>.

The *UX Microcredential* course funded by the *Education Design Lab* started on October 18. This training program prepares students who are interested in User Experience Design to create a case study for their UX Portfolio. Students learn visual design and human centered design, work in groups to complete a final team project and earn a badge in Intercultural Fluency (21st century skill) and a badge in UX Design. We are recruiting for the winter 2022 cohort. Interested applicants must be 18+, have a HS diploma/HSE and legally eligible to work in the US. Learn more and apply here.
