Grants and Awards

In collaboration with **New York City College of Technology** (City Tech), we were awarded \$1 million to develop and deliver From Cannabis to Cuisine: Credentials and Microcredentials for the Culinary Cannabis Industry. The microcredential will be developed using the AFC Specialized Certificate in Culinary Cannabis and Edibles, with oversight from KCC and City Tech alongside local employers including Baked in Bushwick and Fresh Taste Bakery, among others. Once developed, this program will target and train NYC residents with previous marijuana-related convictions, under and un-employed individuals looking to enter the culinary cannabis industry, and current food-service workers looking for upskilling opportunities.

Program and Partnership Updates

In partnership with **Black Women's Blueprint, Restore Forward Institute**, **Young Men's Initiative** and **CUNY**, we will offer a **FREE non-clinical Doula certification training program**. This training is an intensive series of workshops and lectures, hands-on skill development, role-playing, group discussions & activities, guest speakers, and much more. The program will recruit, train and support people of color and allies as community-based doulas and provide holistic, culturally affirming doula support to address the inequalities in parental and infant health outcomes. This training will begin in May and meet twice per week for 5 weeks (90 minute per session) and will include three (3) in person doula shadowing experiences. It will be offered live online via zoom. Cypress Hills Satellite hosted 39 students and staff from Multicultural High School who are interested in attending the SD11 course and take classes at the college. User Experience (UX) - Hillary Stackpole, Christophe Drayton and their team rebranded the BPL BKLYN Incubator program from Hackathon to Flex Into UX!, created a website (FlexIntoUX.com), and placed a call for industry volunteers. Flex Into UX! is designed to help Brooklyn residents learn and gain experience in the tech industry, specifically in the User Experience field. The program will offer Brooklyn residents who are underrepresented in tech the opportunity to try a training program and raise awareness of KCC's free tech training programs. The program will consist of three themes, each with three workshops/lessons (for a total of nine), culminating in the hackathon. The **CLIP Program** worked closely with Enrollment Management and the Advisement Academies to develop a streamlined process to register the students, and to transition exiting students to matriculated programs at Kingsborough. We are proud to announce that fifty (50) CLIP students who were tested and recommended for college placement were invited to a dedicated registration day on February 21, and are transitioning to the college for the Spring 2023 semester.
