Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning

Community Farm and Garden

The **Community Farm and Garden** will remain closed until further notice while the renovations continue this fall. The old lumber has been removed and leveled for the new beds, and we will replenish the soil once the beds are complete and prepare the layout for the children's area, which is set for September.

New Hydroponics at KCC (H-KCC) Learning Lab -We were awarded a grant in the amount of **\$250,000 from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA)** to launch a new **Hydroponics Lab located in T605, in partnership with NY Sun Works**. Hydroponics is an innovative method of growing that uses water-based nutrients to cultivate plants, replacing traditional soil. The grant is part of a \$4.7 million investment in agricultural workforce training at community colleges. The project will begin with a pilot phase targeting recent high school graduates who have shown interest in green economy and alternative farming methods, particularly those from schools with hydroponic facilities. Following the pilot's successful evaluation, the program will expand to accommodate two additional cohorts open to the wider public. **Dr. Shannon Caravello, Assistant Professor of Health Sciences, and Community Farm and Garden Administrator** will spearhead the project. Student Club – We established a new name for the student club connected to the farm-from "Community Cultivation Project" to the "**Farm to Kitchen Club.**" We will partner with Chef Naxielly Dominguez to build a strong club that can host events and activities. Grants and Awards

We submitted three (3) proposals: the **Elevance Health Foundation** proposal; if awarded, these funds will support the development and delivery of a program that will train students as Community Health Workers who specialize in maternal health. We expect to serve 100 students over three years, providing training, wrap-around services, and job-related experiences. A second proposal for \$150,000 to the **New York City Employment and Training Coalition's** (**NYCETC) Tech Bridge Grant**. The grant program seeks to fund partnerships between organizations and training institutions to develop bridge programs, pre-apprenticeships, workbased learning experiences, and wrap-around support. If awarded, we will partner with <u>Reclassify AI</u> to develop a program that bundles KCC's UX microcredential and express Coding for Designers courses with Reclassify's Artificial Intelligence bootcamp. We will train up to 40 students over 12 months. Lastly, a \$100,000 proposal to the **CUNY Adult and Continuing Education (ACE) Upskilling program for a UX Design and Coding**. This program will support the development of a new, comprehensive Coding for UX Design course. Once developed, the new course will be bundled with our highly successful User Experience Design course. This year-long program will train up to 60 students.

Program and Partnership Updates

The Maternal Health Certificate/Doula training program will begin in September. This course will provide students with the foundation to understand the field of maternal health. Students will become trained as doulas and learn to apply basic skills and competencies in various community settings. They will learn about the history and how it plays a role in marginalized communities, recognize how implicit bias, and learn to address persistent and emerging issues surrounding maternal health. We also finalized a partnership with <u>M4MM</u> (Minorities 4 Medical Marijuana) to incorporate "cannavism," racial justice, and cannabis history into the course, and program coordinator <u>Becky Firesheets</u> will be presenting at the upcoming <u>NYATEP</u> conference on best programmatic practices in the cannabis education field.

ESL/HSE/SNAP programs - non-native speakers of English are now registering for the Fall 2023 cohort of the **Strides to Continuing Success ESL/Food Handlers Certificate** training program. Students will improve their English as they learn various kitchen skills and techniques and prepare for the ServSafe and the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene certifications. Students who complete the **FREE** 14-week program can apply seven (7) transfer credits in Culinary Arts in the Department of Tourism and Hospitality at Kingsborough – a great first step in a rewarding food services career.
