We submitted a USDA Workforce Development Grant for \$250K to prepare a curriculum for Urban Farming for Public Health. This new training program will offer urban farmers who want to advance their careers in allied health the opportunity to incorporate gardening/farming opportunities into schools, hospitals, and community-based organizations looking to improve local food systems.

The inaugural Direct Support Professional/Community Habilitation (DSP/Com Hab) training program successfully concluded with 23 students. The program comprises an overview of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, industry-specific certifications, and people-centered approaches to supporting clients. Students received employment readiness support, met with employers, and participated in CPR training. ESL/HSE/SNAP Venture & CLIP Programs

Positive enrollment trends have required the hiring of a new CLIP instructor for the Fall 2024 semester and the implementation of a new **Pre-CLIP program** to accommodate students who do not yet meet the language requirements to participate in CLIP. The **Pre-CLIP program** prepares eligible students for the CUNY Language Immersion Program (CLIP), where students who have been accepted to a CUNY college may benefit from up to four additional semesters of English language instruction before exiting the program and matriculating to college.
