Grant Proposals

The Mother Cabrini Foundation invited KCC to submit proposals for two programs: 1) the Healthcare Scholarship program (\$150,000), which will provide support for students in the Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) and Certified Central Sterile Technician (CST). Scholarships will cover tuition and, in the case of the CST program, the previously unpaid externship. The second proposal is for a Doula and Maternal Health program (\$100,000). If awarded, this will support four cohorts over three years, providing free tuition, exam fees, and stipends.

The New York State Department of Labor released an RFP for a Reemployment Training Grant program to train under and un-employed individuals in regional priority sectors. The Division submitted a \$230,000 proposal for a Direct Support Professional/Community Habilitation Specialist program. DSPs and Com Hab Specialists support individuals with developmental disabilities so they can live independent and fulfilling lives. Mercy Home for Children and Shivoo, our two employer partners, have committed to providing on-the-job learning opportunities and employment upon successful completion.

Workforce Trainings

Maternal Health and DONA Doula Training started on July 1. Forty-one (41) students enrolled, and several guest speakers presented, including Dr. Kevicha Echols, Director of the

Community Health Program and Interim Director of the Health Sciences Program; **Shawnee Benton Gibson**, Author, Activist, and Co-Founder of the ARIAH Foundation; and staff members from the **Caribbean Women's Health Association**. Students interested in applying for the fall 2024 cohort can <u>learn more about the program here</u> and <u>sign up for the waiting list here</u>.

Direct Support Professional/Community Habilitation (DSP/Com Hab) training started on July 8. Thirty (30) students enrolled and are learning about the types of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD) and how to best support individuals with IDD to reach goals and milestones and live more fulfilling lives. Upon completing the training, students will earn four certifications, including CPR/AED/First Aid for Children and Adults. Students will also receive support with employment readiness and job search assistance.

The <u>CUNY Fatherhood Academy (CFA)</u> completed its Spring Cohort. Two students obtained their GED, and nine completed the program. Students received gifts and supplies through our new partnership with the <u>Good Plus Foundation</u>. We are currently recruiting for Fall, which starts on September 9. Candidates must be fathers or expectant fathers between the ages of 18 and 30 and can sign up for an application session here.

The final CompTIA A+ and Network+ cohorts will launch in August and September. Under Alita Maristany's leadership, the program met and exceeded recruitment and completion goals. Graduates work with the Industry Liaison/Employment Specialist to secure employment opportunities in the field. The program is funded until January 31, 2025.

The New Paths to Career Success program concluded this month. Alliah Asramon and in collaboration with College Now and CUNY's K-16 Initiatives, students who graduated from transfer high schools, including International High School at Lafayette, Liberation Diploma Plus, Olympus Academy, Professional Pathways, South Brooklyn Community, and Urban Dove, were provided with the opportunity to enroll in EMT, CPR, CompTIAA+, and Network+ and UX training. They received college and career guidance as well as case management support services. We look forward to hosting future cohorts.

The first cohort of the Contextualized ESL Home Health Aide (HHA) training program was completed this month. The classes provided the knowledge, practical skills, and English language skills required to become a certified HHA. Students also received support services such as metro cards, lunch, books, and the opportunity to attend career fairs and network with potential employers. The second cohort will begin in Fall 2024.
