Grant Proposals

Kingsborough joined five (5) CUNY community colleges (Bronx, LaGuardia, Borough of Manhattan, Queensborough, and Hostos) in partnership with City College's Building Performance Lab in a consortium proposal to the US DOL's Strengthening Community

Colleges, Round 5 grant program. The CUNY Energy Conservation and Building Performance Consortium project will deliver energy conservation and building performance training programs to prepare New Yorkers for in-demand careers with electrical contractors, HVAC service firms, energy service companies, and union apprenticeships. The total award for this consortium grant is \$5.75 million.

The Division was awarded a \$60,000 grant from ConEdison to create the KCC-Con Ed Clean Energy Academy, which will provide career exploration and technical training in Weatherization. The program will teach the fundamentals of building weatherization using the National Center for Construction Education & Research curriculum.
