Please find below some updates and highlights regarding our work within the Division of Workforce Development and Continuing Education for November 2024.

Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning

The Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning hosted an information session with Shivoo, a hiring platform that supports caregiving for intellectually disabled individuals and their families. It also hosted a professional development workshop with guest speaker George Likourezos, a patent attorney, which focused on resume and interview tips for success in the legal field. Students also had the opportunity to participate in an internship application session, where they applied for opportunities that had immediate openings.

The Center partnered with Juliana Dorcelus, transfer manager, to facilitate the semester's second Career Pathways through Education panel, which focused on Healthcare. Guest speakers included Wendy Zhao (KCC Alumnus, RN), Dr. Shella Saint Fleur (Alumnus/Oncologist), and Benjamin Stewart (Pre-Health Professions Program Director at Brooklyn College). Students learned what it takes to get into and succeed in the field and the transfer options available. We thank the panelists for their insights and transparency during the session. Students were very engaged and grateful for the experience.

The Center also partnered with the Art Department to host a virtual job fair for Graphic Design, Animation, and UX students. Utilizing the Handshake platform, students met with employers regarding internship opportunities. Many thanks to the faculty members who helped prepare their students and provided support with identifying employers.

The Center collaborated with the Access Resource Center to host a Financial Health Conference facilitated by JP Morgan Chase. Workshops included Budget/Savings & Credit and Home Buying. A career panel allowed participants to learn about potential career paths within Chase. The workshop had over 40 participants and was open to students, faculty, and staff.

Grant Proposals

The division was awarded \$160,000 from the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation to fund a Kingsborough-Cabrini Healthcare Scholarship fund. Scholarships will be awarded to eligible students enrolled in the Central Sterile Technician (CST) or Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) programs. In addition to tuition, this scholarship will cover a paid 400-hour CST externship totaling \$7,200 per student. The externship is required for certification from the Healthcare Sterile Processing Association and has been a roadblock for many students who need to earn money while in school.

Two cohorts of students also received the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Core and Introduction to Electrical training, which prepares students with information about the basic skills and knowledge needed to become certified construction workers.
