Center for Career Development & Experiential Learning

Grant Proposals

The NYS Office of Cannabis Management's (OCM) Community Reinvestment Grants Program was created to reinvest in communities disproportionately affected by past federal and state drug policies through monetary awards. The OCM and the Cannabis Advisory Board (CAB) aim to support organizations serving youth in designated priority geographies and within communities that faced harms associated with prior drug policies, disproportionate enforcement, and incarceration. Proposed programs do not have to be affiliated with cannabis-related activities. Working with the Maritime Technology Program, the Division submitted a \$100,000 proposal for a Marine Mechanic Training program. This program will develop a noncredit workforce program using the Yamaha Marine Mechanic Training Program curriculum if awarded. This program will conduct outreach to local stakeholders, convene a meeting of the Maritime Advisory Council, create a Bridges to Maritime Technology module,

contextualize the Yamaha curriculum, purchase equipment and materials, and launch a pilot of 12 students.

Workforce Trainings

CUNY Fatherhood Academy - ten (10) students successfully completed the GED program on December 19. Students prepared for and took the GED, participated in Parenting Groups, and received college and employment readiness support. CFA is recruiting for College and Career Prep. Maternal Health and DONA Doula Training program - forty-two (42) students successfully completed the program on December 18. Students earned their CUNY Certificate of Completion and DONA Certificate of Completion in Birth Doula Training, Introduction to Childbirth and Lactation Education. Strengthening Community Colleges (SCC) CompTIA A+ and Network+ cohorts successfully completed their courses on December 10. Students were prepared to take the CompTIA certification exams and received employment and career readiness workshops and 1:1 support. The US Department of Labor funded SCC, which will conclude on January 31, 2025. Special thanks to Alita Maristany, Program Director, for her tireless work marketing, recruiting, and administrating the grant since its inception.

ESL Contextualized HHA and Contextualized Construction - the second cohort of ESL Home Health Aide (HHA) and the the Contextualized first cohort the Contextualized Construction training program completed this month. The training program provided practical and English language skills required to become a certified Home Health Aide and Certified Construction professional to 75 students. Participants improved their English language competency and developed new skill sets to secure future gainful employment. Each student received incentives such as MetroCards, food vouchers, textbooks, uniforms, and access to on-campus wraparound resources such as the career service center, oncampus food pantry, health and wellness centers, screening for public assistance, and accessibility services.

This semester, the new Construction Lab Workforce Training Program collaborated with industry partners and community Board Organizations to complete training for four cohorts. The training began in October/November 2024, enrolling just shy of 100 students into 4 comprehensive construction cohorts. Participants earned several certifications, such as endorsements from the Department of Buildings OSHA 30 / SST 40, the National Center for Education and Research (NCCER), and the Bridges to Renewable Energy / Sustainable Technology (OSW). In addition, 27 of the 97 participants gained industry knowledge and hands-on training in electrical, carpentry, masonry, plumbing, and HVAC. All students received
