## **Workforce Trainings**

On August 11, twenty-eight (28) Maternal Health/DONA Birth Doula and Postpartum doula students out of the 125+ who have completed training since Fall 2024 celebrated on campus with friends, family members, and special guests. Guest speakers included Councilmember Mercedes Narcisse; President Suri Duitch; Amanda Spence of the NYC Department of Health & Mental Hygiene; and Shawnee Benton Gibson, co-founder and CEO of the Spirit of a Woman Leadership Development Institute and the ARIAH Foundation. Benton Gibson's advocacy for Black maternal health is featured in the award-winning documentary "Aftershock." Community Partners, including organizations such as the Caribbean Women's Health Association, Brooklyn Perinatal Network, and the Citywide Doula Initiative, provided information to program graduates.

On August 26th, **CUNY Fatherhood Academy**'s 20th GED cohort kicked off. **Seventeen (17) students were invited to attend this cohort**, and 11 accepted a spot in the program. The program promotes responsible parenting and economic stability for unemployed and underemployed young fathers through education, employment, and personal development. Fathers in the GED/HSE program will receive 16 weeks of academic classes live online via Zoom and in person on campus. In partnership with **STRIVE**, we facilitated a customized **Electronic Health Records Specialist program for 21 students**. Students who completed the training participated in a graduation ceremony and are currently testing with the National Healthcareer Association to earn their E.H.R. credentials. Another cohort is scheduled to begin in September.

In partnership with **Opportunities for a Better Tomorrow**, we completed another **Pharmacy Technician program with 28 students** who are now preparing for the National Healthcareer Association ExCPT exam. Additional programs are scheduled to be offered this Fall.

In collaboration with **New Jewish Home SkillSpring**, we trained **18 students to be Certified Nurse Assistants (CNA**). Students are completing their clinical skills rotation and will be scheduled to take their New York State Prometric exam at Kingsborough thereafter.

The second ConEd-sponsored Weatherization & Clean Energy Academy Training started on August 26th. This free six-week training program focuses on Weatherization, Clean Energy, and Core Construction, offering NCCER certifications, stipends, MetroCards, and other supportive wrap-around services to students. Additionally, the second Non-Credit to Credit Introduction to Welding program started on August 26th. This free 15-week-long training utilizes the American Welding Society Fundamentals and the Maritime Department curriculum. Participants will receive a variety of supportive and wrap-around services, including free PPE, safety equipment, welding equipment, and Metro cards for the students. We are still accepting applicants for the 16-week-long KCC and Seafarers International Union (SIU) Pre-Apprenticeship program. We assist with the application, offer a stipend, and cover the cost to travel to Piney Point, Maryland, and for the training.
