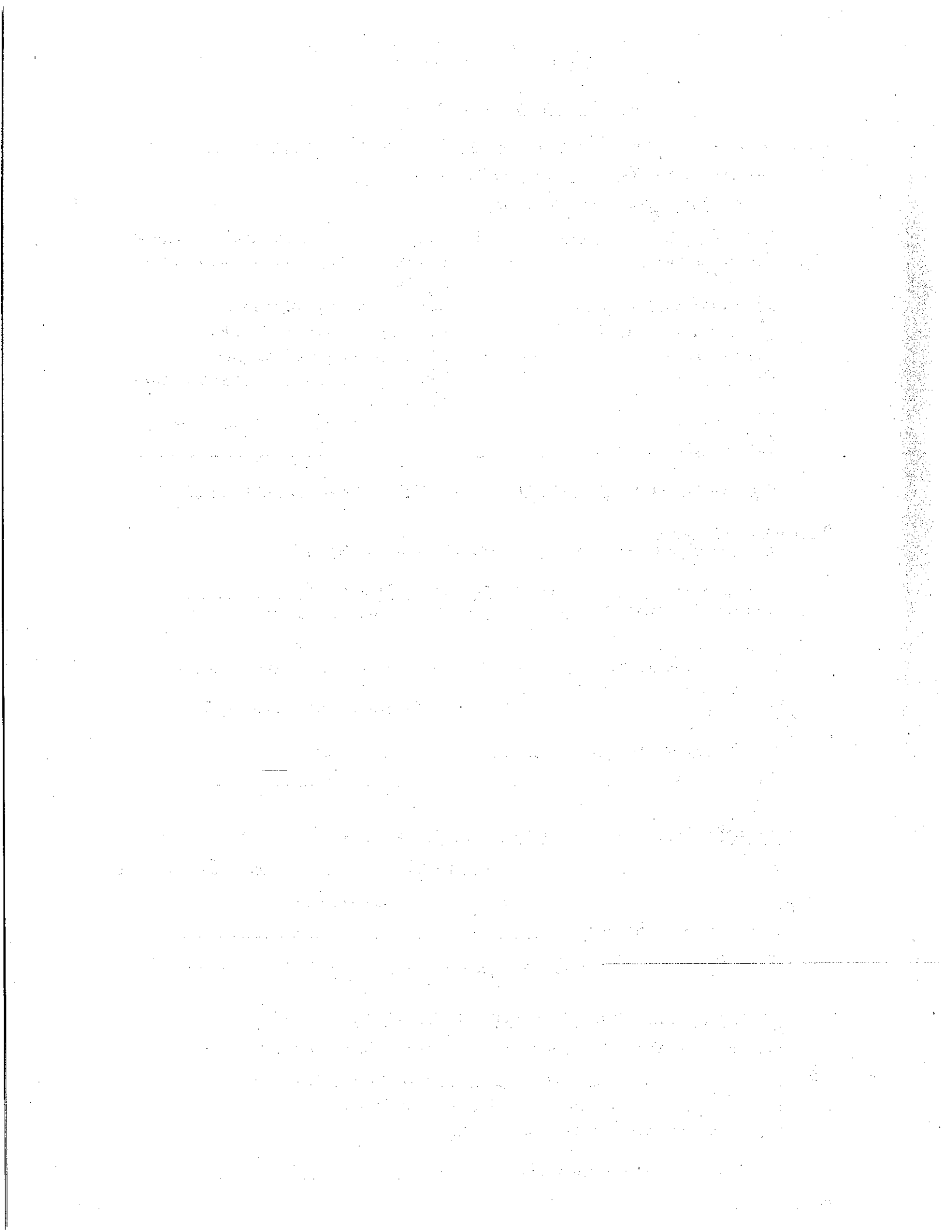

Rationale:

The changes reflect the revisions in the recently agreed-upon Articulation Agreement with Brooklyn College's Department of Early Childhood and Art Education (ECAE) and Department of Childhood, Bilingual and Special Education (CBSE). The ECAE agreement has been signed and the CBSE is in the process of being signed.

- Besides Education Studies, we also have a major entitled Early Childhood/Childcare. Changing the name of the concentration in Education Studies, will clarify the differences.
- New York State has changed Teacher Certification for Childhood Teachers to 1st – 6th Grade.
- Students satisfy Core requirements through Pathways, so we no longer specify the need for Art or Music.
- Brooklyn College ECAE Department will accept our Infant and Toddler Child Development course (EDC 3200) instead of our Social Sciences in Education course (EDC 2100) for our students who are studying within the concentration of Early Childhood.
- Brooklyn College ECAE Department will accept a new course entitled Language and Literacy Development in Young Children, modeled after their course.
- Brooklyn College Education Departments requires our graduates to demonstrate a minimum GPA of 2.8 for acceptance into their departments.
- Brooklyn College ECAE Department requires our graduates to demonstrate a minimum grade of "C" on English 1200, English 2400 and a Math course.
