HIS 6600—Women in the Social Sciences

3 crs. 3 hrs.

An interdisciplinary study of women from a historical and multicultural perspective focusing on the socio-historical and political position of women. Social science and feminist theories are used to analyze gender inequality in society. Gender differences are analyzed to understand women's historical and present social positions. Cross-cultural views of gender are also explored. Race, class, age and sexual orientation as well as gender are central analytical themes revealing the diversity of women's lives.

HIS 66--Introduction to Women's and Gender Studies

3 crs. 3 hrs.

This course, required for the Women's and Gender Studies concentration, provides an interdisciplinary and multicultural introduction to the socio-historical and political position of women, as well as to gender as an analytic category. The course examines the ways that gender intersects with race, class, age, ethnicity, religion, nationality, and sexual orientation to shape women's diverse experiences. Topics include: the history of women's movements in the U.S., transnational feminism, white privilege, women's sexuality and sex-positive feminism, the impact of media on gender roles, and issues for women in the workplace.
