SPE 1100 - Basic Communication Skills and Practice

3 Credit(s) Hours: 3 hrs.

An introductory course in listening and speaking including the basics of human communication, verbal and nonverbal communication, and elements of listening with an emphasis on critical listening. Students will develop and deliver several presentations as well as evaluate the presentations of their peers. Not open to students at ENG 1200 level or higher

Rationale for Change:

There two reasons for this curricular change. Reason one is that in recent years significant attention has been paid to increasing the rigor of the course materials and assignments in the course to make it more challenging. This has included adding more sophisticated material on language history, language development, and metacommunication (i.e., reflection on the communication processes). Previously the course was only open to students in developmental English courses but currently the level of writing and cognition in the course would suit students up to the level of ENG 12. Our hope is that this change will channel more ENG 12 students into SPE 11 while they are still developing their writing skills and conversely free up more SPE 21 seats for students who have completed their ENG 24 as they will need higher level writing skills, idea organization, and source citation skills to be successful in SPE 21.
