RE: Change in Course Description for THA 5800 - Musical Theatre Performance

The Department of Communications & Performing Arts is proposing a change in Course Description for THA 5800 - Musical Theatre Performance:

FROM: Introduction to the theories, techniques and practices of musical theatre performance. The development of appropriate musical, acting and movement skills in conceptualizing, preparing, and performing solos, duets, and ensembles. Individual, small group and ensemble performances culminating in final performances of selected material. Students will also develop additional material and compile an audition book.

TO: Through this course, students will assess, develop and apply the skills and tools necessary for musical theatre performance. Through the study of acting, vocal, movement and dramaturgical techniques, students will develop a unified approach to the study and performance of musical theatre material. Students will incorporate this approach into the analysis and performance of musical theatre repertoire from both traditional and contemporary works of musical theatre.

Rationale for Change:

The change in course description more accurately reflects course content and more clearly differentiates the course from other theatre arts performance courses, thus aiding with articulation and transfer.
