Subject: Change to the Liberal Arts Program Requirements

This memo represents a formal request from the Liberal Arts Chairs Sub-Committee for the following to revisions of the program requirements for the Liberal Arts Major.

1. The inclusion of the Liberal Arts Seminar into the General program requirements for the Liberal Arts Degree.
2. The creation of a 21 credit Liberal Arts degree requirements in conjunction with a Liberal Arts Concentration. This change also includes the above-mentioned Liberal Arts Seminar.

Rationale

Several program reviews of the Liberal Arts program over the past decade have identified as a problem the fact that, as presently constituted, the major is generally experienced by students as a collection of unconnected courses in a variety of disciplines that have their own separate ways of conceptualizing problems, separate vocabularies and separate concepts. This is reflected in the current program requirements. There is no introductory course, little opportunity for career awareness of opportunities in the field, and little sequencing or development of knowledge or skills.

In response, the Liberal Arts Chairs Sub-Committee is proposing the following two changes.

1. Proposed General Liberal Arts Program Requirements for students **who do not enroll** in a concentration. Elective replaced by the LAS.

This change replaces the elective with the proposed Liberal Arts Seminar (LAS) which is aimed at giving every student in the major a solid foundation in what the Liberal Arts is, and introduction to the skills and habits of mind prevalent in the field, an experience using those tools to analyze a specific problem or theme and an overview of the various academic and career options that are available. All incoming Liberal Arts majors will be required to take the LAS in either their first or second semester unless they are coded into the Allied Health group. Transfer students who are entering with 15 or more credits are also exempted from the LAS requirement. The below note has been included to reflect this:

*Transfer students with 15 or more credits and students coded into the Allied Health Student Group are not required to take the Liberal Arts Seminar (LAS) and instead will take 3 credits of Electives. Consultation with an academic advisor is HIGHLY recommended for students meeting this criteria.

2. LA Program Requirements for students **choosing to enroll** in a Concentration

The general LA requirements are reduced by 9 credits to make room for a 9 credit concentration.

This set of requirements will apply to those students who are Liberal Arts Majors who also choose to enroll in a concentration housed within the Liberal Arts Major. The general requirements are reduced by nine credits to make room for a 9 credit concentration. This will provide students with the opportunity to pursue a particular focus within their major program of study. Under separate cover, we have adjusted each of the existing Concentrations to reflect a common 9 credit structure. Our intent is to increase enrollment over time in the concentrations so that more students will have the opportunity to experience a more coherent and focused program of study.

As part of each concentration proposal the following notes will be included in the Course Catalog to ensure consistency where appropriate.

*Students enrolled in a Concentration cannot use the following required courses to also satisfy a CUNY Flexible Core Requirement. Students will take distinct classes to meet their Flexible Core Requirements and are no longer allowed to “double-dip” (see note listed under Major Requirements and Concentration Requirements).

*These courses have a prerequisite. To fulfill the prerequisite, students should select the prerequisite course that meets their major requirement OR select the prerequisite course that meets their CUNY Flexible Core requirement (see Women’s, Gender, and Sexuality Studies Concentration).

*The Secondary Education Concentration is not recommended for students interested in teaching in the STEM fields. Students interested in teaching in STEM should enroll in the corresponding STEM Major (see Secondary Education Concentration).
