Overview:

Current Name: The American Legal System: The Courts

Current Description: Designed for, but not limited to, students interested in a pre-law curriculum. The American judicial process at the federal and state levels will be investigated.

Proposed Change: The United States Judiciary

Change Description to: A study of the nature of the judicial process: precedent and legal reasoning; decision making; the basis of criminal and civil lawsuits; the role of the lawyer, the judge and the public; the organization of state and federal courts; the Supreme Court; democracy and judicial review.

Rationale: this name and description change would bring Kingsborough into alignment with John Jay College of Criminal Justice. As this is a required course for criminal justice majors and we have an agreement with John Jay as a direct transfer college, this change would be logical and clearer to students. The change would also more clearly describe what the course is about. Finally, the course name change would align with learning outcomes language in the required lower level course Pol 5100 U.S. Government.
