On July 14, 2015, Kingsborough Community College unveiled its brand-new \$200,000 STEAM Lab (for the uninitiated, "STEAM" = Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics). Beginning this year, a select group of incoming KCC freshman used this lab for an intensive "boot camp" that focused on 10 areas of study: alternative energy, biomedical engineering, computer graphics and animation, environmental technology, forensics, manufacturing technology, materials science, medical imaging, nursing, and robotics.

For KCC President Farley Herzek, this new lab represents an opportunity for today's students to learn at the cutting edge of these exciting fields, all while using state-of-the art tools and working under the expert guidance of their faculty: "We need educational programs like this," said KCC President Herzek, "opportunities in higher education for students to come to places like this to explore, and for our wonderful faculty to motivate and inspire students to be the best they can be."

As with many groundbreaking initiatives at Kingsborough, the new STEAM Lab was made possible largely through the generosity of the college's distinguished friends and partners.
