Admissions Requirements to Senior College Program (e.g., minimum GPA, audition/portfolio):

Completion of the A.S. degree. Pursuant to University policy, students who have earned a City University Associate in Science (A.S.) degree will be deemed to have automatically fulfilled the lower division liberal arts and science distribution requirements for a baccalaureate degree (Core Studies plus English composition and Speech at Brooklyn College). However, students may be asked to complete a course in a discipline required by Brooklyn College's Core requirements that was not part of the student's associate degree program. In such cases, any coursework required will be applied towards the total number of credits normally required for the baccalaureate degree.

Also, graduates of the A.S. degree program who have not completed at least one year of foreign language study (or established an equivalent proficiency) may be asked to complete six (6) to eight (8) credits of foreign language coursework (or establish an equivalent proficiency) in addition to their normal degree requirements. Proficiency may be established based upon high school coursework, native language abilities, or examination.

NOTE: Students will take electives courses at Brooklyn College, which can be allied with their majors. These electives coupled with the general and departmental required courses will yield 120 credits for the B.A. degree.

The directors of these majors have and will continue to speak on an ongoing basis via email and face to face communication. Topics for discussion will include, but are not limited to, course offerings modifications, prerequisites, student achievement/enrollment and course sequencing.

Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

The director of the Speech Communication major at Kingsborough Community College will forward each semester to the Brooklyn College program director a list of graduates. Likewise, the Brooklyn College director will forward to the Kingsborough director a list of graduates. This will facilitate an evaluation of graduates, length of time the programs, and retention/attrition rates.

Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

Information regarding this joint program will be made available in the college catalogs, on the department websites and at the Admissions Information Centers of both colleges. The Brooklyn College brochure which describes the various speech majors will be updated to include this joint program. Kingsborough will produce a brochure which provides information about the Speech Communication major and its dual/jointly registered program(s) with Brooklyn College. The members of the Kingsborough staff who visit high schools for the purpose of student recruitment will be given information about the Kingsborough/Brooklyn Speech Communication/PC/SLP program. When possible, Brooklyn College faculty will visit students in Kingsborough Speech classes as guest lectures speaking about the KCC-BC dual/jointly registered program(s).

Additional Information: SLP majors at Brooklyn College have grade minimums for courses before they can proceed to the next "tier" of courses. Students must complete Speech 13, 17.8, 17.9 and 31 with "an average of B and no grade lower than C" before they can register for either 28.1 or 38.1. The KCC grades for the 13 and 31 equivalents (KCC Speech 41 and 40 respectfully) will be computed into the BC averaging. Students who fail to maintain the grade minimum at KCC will be required to re-take the course(s) at BC in order to achieve a satisfactory grade.
